Beechwood Youth Club gets extended

In September 2021, Essex Boys and Girls Clubs launched The Beech Youth Club, for children aged 6-16 and it has really taken off, with around 20 attendances each week. In consultation with the BVCT Trustees, we are pleased to report that the club, originally planned to run for 1 year, has now been extended to run for a further year, up to August 2023.



Jamie and his team have built a fantastic rapport with the local community and needless to say, the children were thrilled to learn

that their club would be extended for a further year! Activities at the club include **team games**, **sporting activities** and **arts and crafts**. The club provides a safe space for young people to attend, **socialise** and **express individuality**.

Membership to the Beech Youth Club is **FREE**. Each session costs just 20p and there is always something fun to do.
