personal development prospects for all attendees - if you're into adventure there's opportunity to spend time in nature with **forest schooling** and complete **The Duke of Edinburgh Bronze Award**.

Membership to the Beech Youth Club is **FREE**. Each session costs just 20p and you will always be made to feel welcome. 
Are you a family living in the Beechwood Village and Craylands estates that wants their children to take part in activities but don't have the resources to do so?

We Asked, You Answered...

With the **BVCT** having been around for several years supporting a number of fantastic community projects to engage the residents of Beechwood and Craylands, we recently asked you what you'd like to see provided within the local area. 34% of those who voted would like to see **Children/Youth Activity** and 17% would like to see **Garden Workshops**.

Statistics also showed that we need to improve awareness of the Trust and what the trust can help and support with. 59% of respondents were not aware that the **BVCT** is able to provide support to families with children. Almost 78% were not aware that



the **BVCT** is able to provide grants to individual residents, to get a new idea off the ground and 70% had never viewed the **BVCT website**, which is here: www.beechwoodtrust.org.uk
